- No hunting on Apalachee Preserve.



LOBSTER COVE MEADOW & APPALACHEE PRESERVES

Eastern Ave Boothbay Harbor, Maine

Lobster Cove Meadow and Appalachee encompass two adjacent preserves with over 2.5 miles of trails combined. Conveniently located in close proximity to downtown Boothbay Harbor, these preserves provide an excellent location for joggers and walkers. Lobster Cove Meadow's extensive wetlands and fields also make it ideal for birding. A variety of easy in-and-out trails as well as loop trails exist at Lobster Cove Meadow. The multi-use old road extends to a bridge at the far end of Meadow Brook. After the bridge, a .5-mile privately-owned historic trail connects to Appalachee Preserve. Please be respectful of the neighbor's privacy by staying on the trail and following posted guidelines. Appalachee offers an additional one-mile easy loop-trail with views along Appalachee Pond. Due to the sensitive habitat at these preserves, dogs must be leashed at all times.
