OCEAN POINT PRESERVE

Van Horn Rd
East Boothbay, Maine

Located in the largest wetland area on Linekin Neck in East Boothbay, Ocean Point Preserve features an easy, 1-mile loop trail through a heavily-wooded coniferous forest featuring spruce and fir trees and a forest floor carpeted in thick green moss. The trail leads to the eastern shore of Tibbetts Pond, a significant waterfowl wildlife habitat for inland waterfowl and wading birds.

A short additional scenic vista mid-loop offers wetland viewing that is a popular observation area for birders. The pond provides a popular ice-skating destination for winter recreation.
