

PINE TREE PRESERVE

Ocean Point Rd (Rt 96) Boothbay Harbor, Maine

Pine Tree Preserve is a heavily wooded trail system with 1.5 miles of easy hiking trails. A loop-trail that begins at the kiosk provides an easy walk, approximately 1 mile in length, through mixed forest with views along a small pond that teems with life.

An additional in-and-out trail extends from the far side of the loop trail along an old logging road which gradually rises almost 200 feet from Rt. 96 at the northern edge of the property, providing a high ridgeline overlooking a cemetery and nearby meadow.
