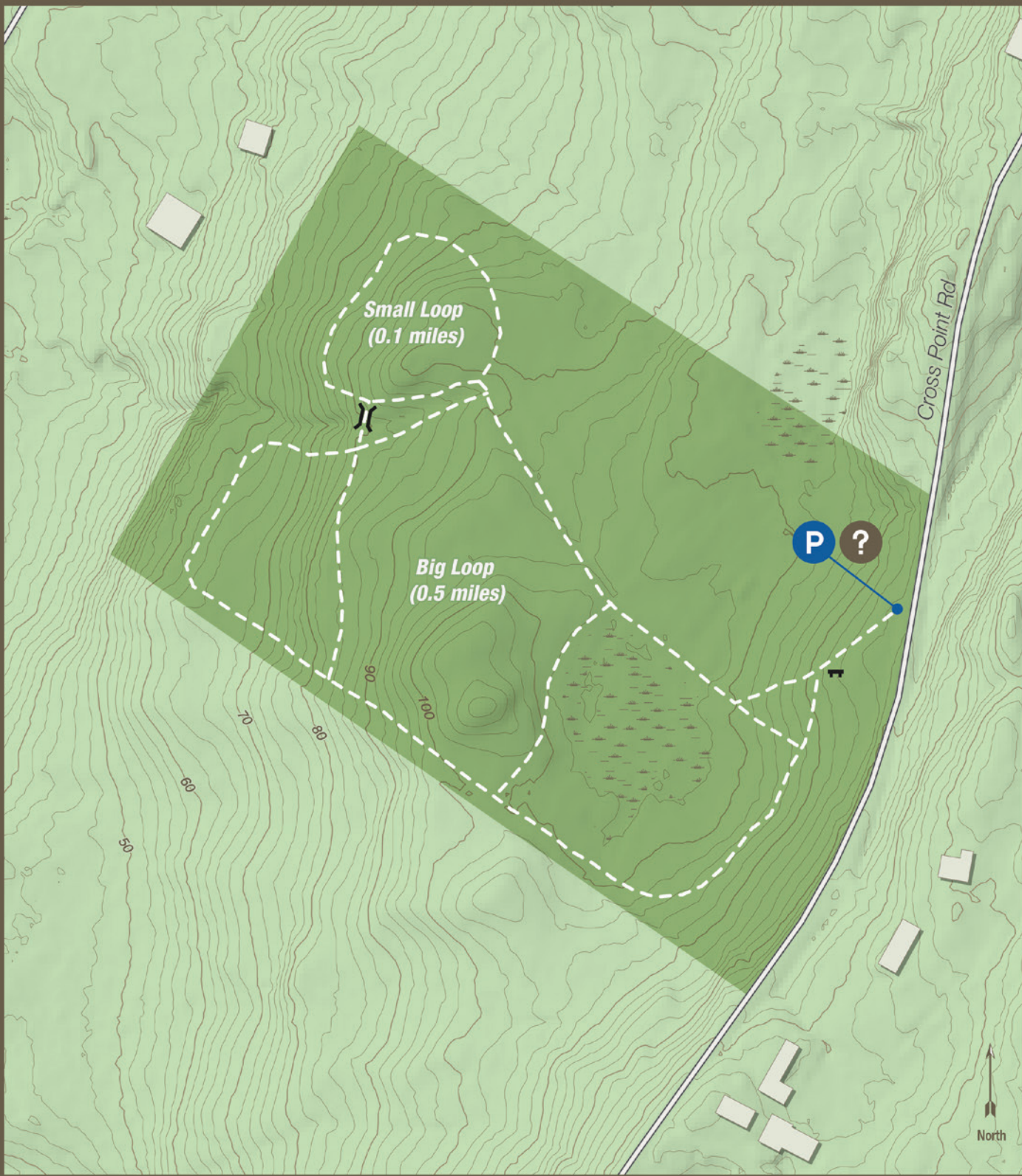


# SINGING MEADOWS PRESERVE

Cross Point Rd  
Edgecomb, Maine

Singing Meadows Preserve consists of a gently rolling field, surrounded by hardwood trees and encompassing a small grove of apple trees and a wetland. This preserve offers an easy .6-mile loop trail over gentle slopes. Cross-country skiing and snowshoeing are options in winter. The meadow is home to an outstanding variety of wildflowers, birds, amphibians, and some mammals. Myriads of butterflies are attracted by the carpets of wildflowers and patches of milkweed.

A wetland traversing a central section of the field attracts frogs and toads, whose calls blend with the chirps of a multitude of insects and melodious songbirds to create a symphony of nature sounds – hence the preserve's name. Due to the sensitive habitat, dogs must be leashed at all times.
