## GUIDELINES

*Thank you for adhering to the following preserve use guidelines:*

- Dogs are not permitted on Damariscove Island.
- Use of two BRLT courtesy moorings are available on a first come, first served basis for up to 24 hours.
- Tie-ups are not permitted on the stone pier, but two courtesy dinghies are available for boaters to use in the harbor.
- The float is in place for visitor use between Memorial Day and Labor Day, and seasonal caretakers are available throughout the summer.
- Tie ups to the float are not permitted — loading and unloading only.
- Please do not climb on historical foundations.
- The former Coast Guard station near the harbor is privately owned. Do not trespass on private property.
- The stone pier is utilized by lobsterman. Please respect working waterfront activities.

# Damariscove Island

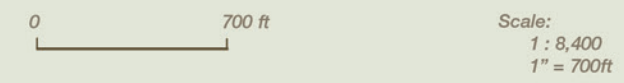
Boothbay, Maine

Damariscove Island is a 210-acre historic island approximately seven miles out to sea from Boothbay Harbor in open ocean. The island offers an excellent, tiny protected harbor that is accessible to boaters. During the summer boating season, the public can access two BRLT courtesy moorings available for up to 24-hours on a first-come basis. Tie-ups are not permitted on the stone pier, but two courtesy dinghies are available to use in the harbor. Summer caretakers provide general information and support to visitors seasonally.

The northern half of Damariscove is a protected bird nesting area without trails. Access is prohibited during the summer nesting season. Because of the nesting birds and the fragile ecosystem, no dogs are permitted on Damariscove at any time.
